



## 2017 CRIME REPORT

*Reflects crime data for Calendar Year 2016, with 6-Year Madison comparative cities table*

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### Offenses Known to Law Enforcement by State, By City, 2016\*

As with other Georgia cities, Madison reports Violent and Property crimes with the appropriate state and federal agencies. Reports reflect data from the previous year (2016 shown below), totaled into Violent and Property crime categories, and tallied per crime classification. Please note that these figures do not encompass the breath of law enforcement activity (traffic enforcement, security detail, crosswalk duty, event support, etc.) or even all of local crime statistics, which are tracked by the Madison Police Department incident report database and tabulated by the Planning & Community Development for annual reporting to the Department of Community Affairs (part of Opportunity Zone reporting). For Comprehensive Planning data collection in 2016, MadisonGIS mapped a 4-year history utilizing the local incident report provided by the Madison Police Department.

### Comparative Cities Table (see reverse side)

- In Madison, violent crime remained low and property crime decreased again in 2016, reaching a new six year low. The only noticeable different was in violent crime where robbery (use of force, threat, or intimidation) and aggravated assault (use of a weapon) were more evenly distributed.
- In terms of violent crime, Madison is remains on the low end and comparable to Social Circle and Watkinsville, with about half of the violent crime experienced by Eatonton (where there was a marked annual decrease) and Greensboro (where there was a return to 2010-2012 levels).
- In terms of property crime, Madison remains on the high end and comparable to Eatonton, certainly more elevated than Greensboro, double that of Social Circle, and triple that of Watkinsville despite continued diminishment in 2016.
